- Gender and human values are part of every single programme

of the institution. Most of the programmes offer one or more courses where the focus is gender sensitization. Apart from representation in the courses, the institution organizes gender sensitization programmes for its students throughout the year.

- Being a Gandhian institution, most of the programmes offer courses on the environment and sustainability. At the undergraduate level, 'Introduction to Environment' is a compulsory course. Many departments, such as Rural Economics or Microbiology, offer specialized courses on environment and sustainability.

## 2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organises special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

- Students in Gujarat Vidyapith mostly come from rural localities. As a result, there is a significant difference in their level of education. Orientation program i.e. Abhimukta Karyakram is organized for new students to bridge this gap. In this program, slow learners and fast learners can be distinguished from the students through various activities, besides, since the teacher student ratio in Gujarat Vidyapith is good, it becomes easier to identify the students according to their ability.
- Different learning opportunities are provided for slow learner students. As some departments conduct bridge courses, some departments have arranged tutorials in addition to the classroom where the students try to improve the level of the students through different assignments. Also, if a student has difficulty in any subject, she/he can contact the teacher directly.
- Efforts are made to develop critical thinking among the fast-learning students. For this, different types of programs are organized like various lecture series, departmental seminars, group discussions, panel discussions etc. Where the student gets acquainted with the practical aspect of his subject.
- The prayer hall is a forum where students can present their views. Students can interact with the eminent scholars and constructive workers, working at different levels in the society.

### 2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

- Various learning processes are used in different courses of the Vidyapith, such as fieldwork, internship, project work, rural-study, educational tour, etc. to develop the ability to examine the subject in tangible situations.
- **Experiential learning:** The students of various departments, go to the villages for their studies and study the various institutions. The students of Department of Social Work, study their subject in practice in various NGO's working in different areas. Modules are designed to teach different unit parts in different studies.
- **Problem Solving:** Students in each subject undertake a research project to test theory in practice at post-graduate level and in few subjects the research project also part at under-graduate level. Resulting in an understanding of how to examine their subject in practice and how to solve problems encountered in the process.
- **Participatory Learning:** Vidyapith hostels are completely managed by the students, with the role of wardens and their mentor teachers as a guide. Programs like padayatras and village-camps are completely organized and managed by the students. Students have to organize various programs in the village, interact with the people and get familiar with the rural conditions and problems in practice.

2.3.2 - Teachers use ICT enabled tools including online resources for effective teaching and learning processes during the year

- Every faculty of the university has ICT resources, where teachers can use it to teach the subject more effectively. In addition to the use of e-resources by teachers in the classroom, e-resource based assignments are also given to students so that students can make extensive use of these types of resources.
- There has been significant progress in this field post-Covid as online classes have made it much easier for students to learn and use e-resources like Pathashala, although all these resources are certified by teachers.
- Also, some teachers contribute to preparing e-resources by running their YouTube channel where they posted their lectures online for the future generation of learners too. The IQAC issued advisory to the teachers to prepare online audio-video content of their own with the help of audiovisual department of the university. The plan is also afoot to ensure that enough material is available for online courses.

## 2.6 - Student Performance and Learning Outcomes

2.6.1 - The institution has stated learning outcomes (generic and programme specific)/graduate attributes which are integrated into the assessment process and widely publicized through the

website and other documents

- The institution has clearly defined program outcomes, program-specific outcomes, and course outcomes. Course outcomes undergo assessment through both continuous evaluation processes and semester-end examinations. The continuous evaluation involves various components such as assignments, seminars, debates, quizzes, and field assignments.
- The evaluation process takes into account the specified course outcomes. The entire department reviews program outcomes, assessing whether students have demonstrated most or all of the program-specific outcomes through their engagement in various activities and programs. This assessment spans six semesters at the undergraduate level and four semesters at the postgraduate level.
- Evaluation of generic program outcomes occurs through students' participation in institutional activities like community living, supporting peers, showcasing handicraft skills, maintaining cleanliness, and actively engaging in morning assemblies. Students' performance is also assessed during extension programs such as NSS camps and Gram Jeevan Yatra. These initiatives provide an opportunity to gauge whether students have developed a sufficient level of empathy for societal issues and are willing to contribute to community welfare.

- The institution conducts program outcome assessments at the conclusion of each program, with evaluations taking place after three years for undergraduate programs and after two years for postgraduate programs. These evaluations encompass students' participation in extension activities like NSS camps and Gram Jeevan Yatras.
- The assessment specifically considers interpersonal communication skills, adaptability in challenging circumstances, and students' empathy towards the less privileged in society. Program-specific outcomes undergo annual evaluations and are also assessed at the program's conclusion. This evaluation relies on students' performance

across all semesters, ensuring they have achieved the designated outcomes for their specific programs.

- Course outcomes, including critical thinking and self-reflection, are assessed every semester through continuous evaluation processes and end-of-semester examinations. The resulting mark sheet encompasses these evaluations, incorporating course assessments along with essential attributes of graduates, such as critical thinking, readiness to collaborate with communities, and a demonstrated level of empathy for all segments of society.

## RESEARCH, INNOVATIONS AND EXTENSION

### 3.1 - Promotion of Research and Facilities

3.1.1 - The institution Research facilities are frequently updated and there is well defined policy for promotion of research which is uploaded on the institutional website and implemented

- Gujarat Vidyapith has a well-established research policy, prominently displayed on the institutional website to familiarize new researchers with the research environment. The institution's research endeavors encompass applied sciences, social sciences, humanities, and community engagements. Upon enrolling in research programs, new scholars participate in an orientation program that not only

covers research methodologies but also emphasizes the institution's research ethics and policies.

- The institute's research infrastructure includes libraries, research laboratories (covering physics, chemistry, microbiology, biotechnology, biogas, physiology, and computer science), unrestricted internet access, and dedicated workstations. The extensive library collection comprises over 600,000 books and 80 print journals, complemented by access to over 7,000 e-journals and international databases. A key highlight is the integration of modern technology into the teaching-learning process, exemplified by 65 Technology-Enabled classrooms and halls. These spaces feature LAN/Wi-Fi connectivity and LCD projectors, facilitating a diverse range of programs, from educational seminars to extracurricular activities hosted in a well-equipped auditorium.
- At the heart of Gujarat Vidyapith lies an extensive collection that surpasses 6 lakh books, encompassing volume sets, rare texts, and valuable reference materials.
- To cater to the evolving academic and research needs of students, each of the three campuses features a well-appointed computer center. These campuses are interconnected through a wireless internet network, enhancing communication and enabling seamless access to online resources.
- Notably, the rural campuses also offer a wealth of facilities, including furnished lecture halls and prayer rooms, all diligently maintained and sufficiently equipped. In various academic blocks, a total of 7 multipurpose halls serve as versatile venues for seminars and community prayers, designed to accommodate the diverse needs of the campus community.

- For visitors, Gujarat Vidyapith boasts a well-equipped guest house with essential amenities, including a conference room, dining hall, Wi-Fi-enabled rooms and a comfortable rest area. The institution's canteens offer a variety of nutritious meal options for breakfast, lunch, and dinner, ensuring that guests are well taken care of.
- Across all campuses, convenient access to natural water coolers is available. Banking and ATM services are within easy reach. Sustainable energy practices with the integration of solar rooftop facilities, particularly in the Ahmedabad campuses. To promote the use of Khadi products, students and teachers have ready access. The institution maintains a fleet of buses and vehicles to support academic, research, and outreach activities, making transportation hassle-free.

## 4.2 - Library as a Learning Resource

4.2.1 - Library is automated using Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) and has digitisation facility

The Gujarat Vidyapith library has a vast collection of over 600,000 items, including books, reference materials, copyrighted works, children's literature, rare books, manuscripts, and journal volumes. To efficiently manage its daily operations, the library has implemented the SOUL 2.0 integrated library management system developed by INFLIBNET (IUC-UGC). The library initially used an in-house software system based on the Sybase Database, but later transitioned to SOUL 1.0. Subsequently, the library successfully migrated its data to the upgraded SOUL 2.0 version.

Currently, the library is fully automated using SOUL 2.0. All items are barcoded for streamlined book issuance and return processes, including user membership cards.

The library also has an in-house digitization facility lab established with the support of INFLIBNET Centre. The lab has a server, nine high-end PCs with scanners, and internet connectivity. It has played a vital role in digitizing over 500 theses, which are now available on both the institutional repository and the Shodhganga platform. Additionally, the library collaborated with the Centre for Development of Advanced Computing (C-DAC) to digitize more than 32,000 books. Moreover, the library has digital copies of 627 rare manuscripts and over 800 documents related to Gandhian literature.

- The Estate Department bears the responsibility of upkeeping all the campuses and buildings, with a skilled maintenance workforce encompassing plumbers, pump operators, electricians, carpenters, and more. When it comes to substantial repairs and major maintenance projects, these efforts through external contractor agreements, while smaller-scale are efficiently managed internally.
- For security operations, the institution has opted for outsourced arrangements with non-skilled employees. This external workforce, operating under limited contractual commitments, is entrusted with maintaining classrooms, guest houses, the campus grounds, as well as seminar and halls. The central library is efficiently run by a dedicated team of librarians and support staff, ensuring the availability of instructional materials.
- In-house maintenance of personal computers, vital software, and various peripherals utilized across Gujarat Vidyapith departments falls under the purview of the computer department, USIC, and system personnel. Remarkably, the institution's commitment to cost-effectiveness is



underscored by its unique approach; it foregoes the use of AMC for its ICT assets and instead relies on a "learning by doing" initiative to achieve savings.

- Within the Science Department, laboratories are overseen by qualified educators serving as lab in-charges, complemented by Lab Assistants and attendants. The Physical Director takes charge of sports facilities and ensures equipment distribution in accordance with activity schedules. Safety is paramount, with strategically positioned fire extinguishers throughout the structures.
- To maintain internet connectivity and oversee the CCTV security system, a dedicated network and system management team has been put in place, complemented by the recruitment of security personnel to safeguard the entire facility.

## 5.4 - Alumni Engagement

- Many departments at Gujarat Vidyapith maintain their own alumni associations, with some, like computer science and social work, being officially registered, while the majority remain unregistered. 6.1.2 - The effective leadership is reflected in various institutional practices such as decentralization and participative management

The leadership in Gujarat Vidyapith is dispersed at multiple levels. The Vice Chancellor is the head of the institute whereas the registrar acts as a head of the administrative set-up. But no decision is taken without the participation of teachers at each level. The Departmental Advisory Committee (DAC) consists of every teacher in the department. The HoD cannot take any decision without putting it first in the DAC. Similarly, each HoD represents the opinion of the entire department at the level of the faculty. The Dean of each faculty must consult each HoD before coming to any decision. Similarly, the two rural campuses of Gujarat Vidyapith enjoy a lot of freedom in its activities at the campus level. The rural campuses are supervised by the campus coordinators. These coordinators are part of most of the crucial decision-making bodies of the institute such as Gujarat Vidyapith Sponsoring Agency.

Apart from the teachers, students are also part of the decision-making process in the smooth functioning of the co-curricular and extra-curricular activities of the institute as well as in the functioning of all the hostels in the institute.

- The most important strategic plan for the year 2022-23 was to finish NAAC Peer Team Visit. In order to achieve this, all the departments of the institution got their documentation ready by the middle of June 2022. Different committees were set up to ensure that the entire operation runs smoothly. Both teachers, non-teaching staff, and students participated actively in all the activities related to the NAAC Peer Team visit.
- NAAC Cycle - 2 exercise, the institution geared itself towards implementation of NEP 2020 from the academic year

2023-24. A committee under a nodal officer is set up to prepare a roadmap for implementation. The committee held many meetings during the course of the year and by April 2023, the entire framework along with the syllabi of first two semesters were ready. - All the academic and administrative bodies have their own clearly defined policies and executive responsibilities. The vice chancellor is the overall executive head of the institution, and the registrar is responsible for all the administrative management of the institute. The important bodies of the institution are the Board of Management, Executive Council, Higher Education Planning and Monitoring Committee, Finance Committee, Academic Council, and Grievance Redressal Committee. To ensure smooth functioning of the academic and administrative set-up, the BoM of the institution set up 12 different branches to deal with administrative issues.
- The service rules and regulations follow UGC and DoPT guidelines wherever they are applicable. All the academic appointments are made according to the norms of UGC and appointments in the administrative section follow DoPT norms. Apart from these, the institute also has a policy for recruitment of ad-hoc people in category IV whose salaries are paid by the Gujarat Vidyapith Sponsoring Agency. - Gujarat Vidyapith has designed and implemented 14 different kinds of appraisal forms for various categories of staff members. Annual Performance Appraisal Reports (APAR) are collected from the staff members after the end of every financial year. These reports cover all aspects of the work as well as the living environment of the institution. An employee is expected to fill in the form and submit it to the immediate superior. For instance, a teaching staff's APAR will go to the respective HoD and then to the Dean of the faculty and then to the coordinator of the campus. After their comments, the final authority is the vice chancellor for the teaching staff. The final authority for non-teaching staff is the registrar. The APAR with all the comments and signatures is then sent back to the respective employee by e-mail within six months of the submission by the employee.
- All APARs are filled online only and their verification is also done electronically only.
- The promotional avenues for the teaching staff are CAS and direct recruitment according to the UGC norms. The promotional avenues for non-teaching staff are as per the rules of DoPT.

## 6.4 - Financial Management and Resource Mobilization

### 6.4.1 - Institutional strategies for mobilisation of funds and the optimal utilisation of resources

Most of the students of Gujarat Vidyapith come from economically deprived communities. The education fees and hostel fees are kept at a minimal level so that students do not have to leave their studies mid-way. Apart from the scholarship given by the state government, the institution also provides scholarships to those



students who do not get any other scholarship. To instill a sense of independence and pride among the students, the institution also offers Swabhiman Scholarship where students are given some manual work on the campuses for around 30 hours in a month. Students are paid at the rate of Rs. 40 per hour. The monthly emolument covers their food bill. Students also work in the institute during the summer vacation where they work for 8 hours every day, and they earn upto Rs. 16000/- which is enough to take care of their education and hostel mess fees.

The institution rents out its properties such as seminar halls and canteen facilities to other organizations for nominal fees. The fees are used for the upkeep of the institutional properties.

#### 6.4.4 - Institution conducts internal and external financial audits regularly

Gujarat Vidyapith carries out internal and external financial audits regularly. All the bills for payment are audited internally before the payment. Another internal audit is done after the payment. The internal audit of the institution is carried out by

the accounts department of the institution twice a year. The next step is a statutory audit which is done by a Chartered Accountant (CA). Any quarry raised during these audits are answered by the Registrar and the accounts department of the institution.

From the year 2003 onwards, the office of the Accountant General (AG) of Gujarat also audits the financial matters of the institution. If there are any discrepancy in the accounts, AG sends half-margin paragraphs to the institution seeking explanation. Such objections are taken up by the Registrar and the accounts department who provide explanations. These explanations are also tabled in the appropriate bodies of the institution. If the AG is satisfied with the response, the objection is dropped otherwise the matter is reported to the office of Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) which in turn seeks clarifications from the institution. These clarifications are provided by the Registrar.

Additionally, all three campuses are equipped with hospitals, staffed by trained medical personnel, and equipped with ambulances for emergencies.
- The institute has special counseling rooms within hostels and departments to address career, personal, and mental health concerns. Expert lectures and workshops further enhance the counseling services.

## 2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

### 2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organises special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

- Students in Gujarat Vidyapith mostly come from rural localities. As a result, there is a significant difference in their level of education. Orientation program i.e. Abhimukta Karyakram is organized for new students to bridge this gap. In this program, slow learners and fast learners can be distinguished from the students through various activities, besides, since the teacher student ratio in Gujarat Vidyapith is good, it becomes easier to identify the students according to their ability.
- Different learning opportunities are provided for slow learner students. As some departments conduct bridge courses, some departments have arranged tutorials in addition to the classroom where the students try to improve the level of the students through different assignments. Also, if a student has difficulty in any subject, she/he can contact the teacher directly.
- Efforts are made to develop critical thinking among the fast-learning students. For this, different types of programs are organized like various lecture series, departmental seminars, group discussions, panel discussions etc. Where the student gets acquainted with

the practical aspect of his subject.

- The prayer hall is a forum where students can present their views. Students can interact with the eminent scholars and constructive workers, working at different levels in the society.

### 2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

- Various learning processes are used in different courses of the Vidyapith, such as fieldwork, internship, project work, rural-study, educational tour, etc. to develop the ability to examine the subject in tangible situations.
- Experiential learning: The students of various departments, go to the villages for their studies and study the various institutions. The students of Department of Social Work, study their subject in practice in various NGO's working in different areas. Modules are designed to teach different unit parts in different studies.
- Problem Solving: Students in each subject undertake a research project to test theory in practice at post-graduate level and in few subjects the research project also part at under-graduate level. Resulting in an understanding of how to examine their subject in practice and how to solve problems encountered in the process.



- **Participatory Learning:** Vidyapith hostels are completely managed by the students, with the role of wardens and their mentor teachers as a guide. Programs like padayatras and village-camps are completely organized and managed by the students. Students have to organize various programs in the village, interact with the people and get familiar with the rural conditions and problems in practice.

- Every faculty of the university has ICT resources, where teachers can use it to teach the subject more effectively. In addition to the use of e-resources by teachers in the classroom, e-resource based assignments are also given to students so that students can make extensive use of these types of resources.
- There has been significant progress in this field post-Covid as online classes have made it much easier for students to learn and use e-resources like Pathashala, although all these resources are certified by teachers.
- Also, some teachers contribute to preparing e-resources by running their YouTube channel where they posted their lectures online for the future generation of learners too. The IQAC issued advisory to the teachers to prepare online audio-video content of their own with the help of audiovisual department of the university. The plan is also afoot to ensure that enough material is available for online courses.

- The institution has clearly defined program outcomes, program-specific outcomes, and course outcomes. Course outcomes undergo assessment through both continuous evaluation processes and semester-end examinations. A key highlight is the integration of modern technology into the teaching-learning process, exemplified by 65 Technology-Enabled classrooms and halls. These spaces feature LAN/Wi-Fi connectivity and LCD projectors, facilitating a diverse range of programs, from educational seminars to extracurricular activities hosted in a well-equipped auditorium.
- At the heart of Gujarat Vidyapith lies an extensive collection that surpasses 6 lakh books, encompassing volume sets, rare texts, and valuable reference materials.
- To cater to the evolving academic and research needs of students, each of the three campuses features a well-appointed computer center. These campuses are interconnected through a wireless internet network, enhancing communication and enabling seamless access to online resources.
- Notably, the rural campuses also offer a wealth of facilities, including furnished lecture halls and prayer rooms, all diligently maintained and sufficiently equipped. In various academic blocks, a total of 7 multipurpose halls serve as versatile venues for seminars and community prayers, designed to accommodate the diverse needs of the campus community.

## 4.2 - Library as a Learning Resource

4.2.1 - Library is automated using Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) and has digitisation facility

The Gujarat Vidyapith library has a vast collection of over 600,000 items, including books, reference materials, copyrighted works, children's literature, rare books, manuscripts, and journal volumes. To efficiently manage its daily operations, the library has implemented the SOUL 2.0 integrated library management system developed by INFLIBNET (IUC-UGC). The library initially used an in-house software system based on the Sybase Database, but later transitioned to SOUL 1.0. Subsequently, the library successfully migrated its data to the upgraded SOUL 2.0 version.

Currently, the library is fully automated using SOUL 2.0. All items are barcoded for streamlined book issuance and return processes, including user membership cards.

The library also has an in-house digitization facility lab established with the support of INFLIBNET Centre. The lab has a server, nine high-end PCs with scanners, and internet connectivity. It has played a vital role in digitizing over 500 theses, which are now available on both the institutional repository and the Shodhganga platform. Additionally, the library collaborated with the Centre for Development of Advanced Computing (C-DAC) to digitize more than 32,000 books. Moreover, the library has digital copies of 627 rare manuscripts and over 800 documents related to Gandhian literature.

4.4.2 - There are established systems and procedures for maintaining and utilizing physical, academic and support facilities - laboratory, library, sports complex, computers, classrooms etc.

- The Estate Department bears the responsibility of upkeeping all the campuses and buildings, with a skilled maintenance workforce encompassing plumbers, pump operators, electricians, carpenters, and more. When it comes to substantial repairs and major maintenance projects, these efforts through external contractor agreements, while smaller-scale are efficiently managed internally.
- For security operations, the institution has opted for outsourced arrangements with non-skilled employees. This external workforce, operating under limited contractual commitments, is entrusted with maintaining classrooms, guest houses, the campus grounds, as well as seminar and halls. The central library is efficiently run by a

dedicated team of librarians and support staff, ensuring the availability of instructional materials.

- In-house maintenance of personal computers, vital software, and various peripherals utilized across Gujarat Vidyapith departments falls under the purview of the computer department, USIC, and system personnel. Remarkably, the institution's commitment to cost-effectiveness is underscored by its unique approach; it foregoes the use of AMC for its ICT assets and instead relies on a "learning by doing" initiative to achieve savings.
- Within the Science Department, laboratories are overseen by qualified educators serving as lab in-charges, complemented by Lab Assistants and attendants. The Physical Director takes charge of sports facilities and ensures equipment distribution in accordance with activity schedules. Safety is paramount, with strategically positioned fire extinguishers throughout the structures.
- To maintain internet connectivity and oversee the CCTV security system, a dedicated network and system management team has been put in place, complemented by the recruitment of security personnel to safeguard the entire facility.

The leadership in Gujarat Vidyapith is dispersed at multiple levels. The Vice Chancellor is the head of the institute whereas the registrar acts as a head of the administrative set-up. But no decision is taken without the participation of teachers at each level. The Departmental Advisory Committee (DAC) consists of every teacher in the department. The HoD cannot take any decision without putting it first in the DAC. Similarly, each HoD represents the opinion of the entire department at the level of the faculty. The Dean of each faculty must consult each HoD before coming to any decision. Similarly, the two rural campuses of Gujarat Vidyapith enjoy a lot of freedom in its activities at the campus level. ## 6.2 - Strategy Development and Deployment

- The most important strategic plan for the year 2022-23 was to finish NAAC Peer Team Visit. In order to achieve this, all the departments of the institution got their documentation ready by the middle of June 2022. Different committees were set up to ensure that the entire operation runs smoothly. Both teachers, non-teaching staff, and students participated actively in all the activities related to the NAAC Peer Team visit.
- NAAC Cycle - 2 exercise, the institution geared itself towards implementation of NEP 2020 from the academic year 2023-24. ### 6.3 - Faculty Empowerment Strategies

6.3.1 - The institution has a performance appraisal system, promotional avenues and effective welfare measures for teaching and non-teaching staff

- Gujarat Vidyapith has designed and implemented 14 different kinds of appraisal forms for various categories of staff members. Annual Performance Appraisal Reports (APAR) are collected from the staff members after the end of every financial year. These reports cover all aspects of the work as well as the living environment of the institution. An employee is expected to fill in the form and submit it to the immediate superior. For instance, a teaching staff's APAR will go to the respective HoD and then to the Dean of the faculty and then to the

coordinator of the campus. After their comments, the final authority is the vice chancellor for the teaching staff. The final authority for non-teaching staff is the registrar. The APAR with all the comments and signatures is then sent back to the respective employee by e-mail within six months of the submission by the employee.

- All APARs are filled online only and their verification is also done electronically only.

##### 6.4.1 - Institutional strategies for mobilisation of funds and the optimal utilisation of resources

Most of the students of Gujarat Vidyapith come from economically deprived communities. The education fees and hostel fees are kept at a minimal level so that students do not have to leave their studies mid-way. Apart from the scholarship given by the state government, the institution also provides scholarships to those students who do not get any other scholarship. To instill a sense of independence and pride among the students, the institution also offers Swabhiman Scholarship where students are given some manual work on the campuses for around 30 hours in a month. Students are paid at the rate of Rs. 40 per hour. The monthly emolument covers their food bill. Students also work in the institute during the summer vacation where they work for 8 hours every day, and they earn upto Rs. 16000/- which is enough to take care of their education and hostel mess fees.

The institution rents out its properties such as seminar halls and canteen facilities to other organizations for nominal fees. The fees are used for the upkeep of the institutional properties.

**6.4.4 - Institution conducts internal and external financial audits regularly**

Gujarat Vidyapith carries out internal and external financial audits regularly. All the bills for payment are audited internally before the payment. Another internal audit is done after the payment. The internal audit of the institution is carried out by the accounts department of the institution twice a year. The next step is a statutory audit which is done by a Chartered Accountant (CA). Any quarry raised during these audits are answered by the Registrar and the accounts department of the institution.

From the year 2003 onwards, the office of the Accountant General (AG) of Gujarat also audits the financial matters of the institution. If there are any discrepancy in the accounts, AG sends half-margin paragraphs to the institution seeking explanation. Such objections are taken up by the Registrar and the accounts department who provide explanations. These explanations are also tabled in the appropriate bodies of the institution. If the AG is satisfied with the response, the objection is dropped otherwise the matter is reported to the office of Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) which in turn seeks clarifications from the institution. These clarifications are provided by the Registrar.

- Gujarat Vidyapith has its genesis in safety and empowerment for girls from remote and marginalized backgrounds seeking higher education. Parents from the hinterlands have made the institute their preferred choice due to its unwavering commitment to the safety and security of its female students.

- The active Women Development Cell along with the Internal Grievance Redressal Cell on all three campuses organizes mentoring events and sensitization programmes at hostels and at departments. Prioritizing safety, the campus has boundary walls and surveillance cameras installed adequately.
- Students require permission to leave, and any form of ragging is strictly prohibited, and closely monitored by vigilant faculty and staff. Senior students warmly embrace newcomers, fostering a welcoming and homely atmosphere. Additionally, all three campuses are equipped with hospitals, staffed by trained medical personnel, and equipped with ambulances for emergencies.
- The institute has special counseling rooms within hostels and departments to address career, personal, and mental health concerns. Expert lectures and workshops further enhance the counseling services.
- Common rooms are equipped with televisions and audio systems and host various activities, promoting a culture of sharing and mutual care.

Waste Management at Gujarat Vidyapith is a comprehensive and eco-conscious endeavor:

- **Solid Waste Management:** The Ahmedabad and Sadra campuses employ biogas facilities to convert human, animal, and organic waste into a valuable source of fuel for hostels and canteens. Regular composting is practiced at all three campuses. Non-biodegradable waste is meticulously sorted and managed through collaboration with the municipal collection system.
- **Liquid Waste Management:** Underground drainage systems equipped with absorption pits effectively manage liquid waste in hostels, residential areas, and departments. The waste water filtration plant has been installed at Sadra campus.
- **Biomedical Waste Management:** All campuses have implemented organized systems for the collection and proper disposal of biomedical waste, ensuring the safe handling of such materials.
- **E-Waste Management:** The institute places great emphasis on raising awareness about e-waste and encourages reuse while adhering to energy efficiency standards.

## 7.2 - Best Practices

7.2.1 - Describe one best practice successfully implemented by the Institution as per NAAC format provided in the Manual

- The faculty of physical education and sports sciences has an internship course where all the students are expected to work as interns in different institutions in the capacity of coach or referee or volunteer to understand real life work culture and gain on-the-job experience. Govt. of Gujarat hosted the 36th National Games of India in September and October 2022. This was a prestigious event. The govt. of Gujarat roped in the faculty of physical education and sports sciences of Gujarat Vidyapith for administration and support during the games. Prof. Niraj Silawat of Gujarat Vidyapith was made venue manager of IIT Gandhinagar sports complex where some of the events were organized. Prof. Silawat and other faculty members prepared a list of 145 students who were given special training for working in different capacities during the organization of the event. All the students worked tirelessly throughout the two week of the games and got valuable exposure to the real life management of a sports event. This also gave them opportunity to interact with players of the national level. Also, the govt. of Gujarat paid Rs. 12,80,000/- towards honorarium to all these volunteer-interns.

## 7.3 - Institutional Distinctiveness

7.3.1 - Highlight the performance of the institution in an area distinct to its priority and thrust (within a maximum of 200 words)

- Gandhi Gram Jeevan Yatra is a regular calendar event of Gujarat Vidyapith which aims at giving students exposure to the life, livelihood, culture, and problems faced by

rural population in different parts of Gujarat. Every year, around 120 teams visit around 600 villages of Gujarat. The institution spends lot of money on this programme every year. As the institution found itself in a position where it could no longer fund this activity, faculty of physical education and sports sciences teamed up with the Dept. of Higher Education of govt. of Gujarat. Dept. of Higher Education wanted to reach in different villages of Gujarat to propagate the idea of 'Five Pledges to Make India Great Again' as envisaged by the Honourable Governor Gujarat. But the Dept. did not have the resources to reach in all villages. The faculty of physical education and sports sciences approached the Dept. and offered to take their activities in 75 different villages of Dahegam taluka of Gandhinagar district along with carrying out their own yatra. The Dept. agreed to it and paid Rs. 1,80,000/- towards the entire project. This saved money for the institution and kept the annual event going.
